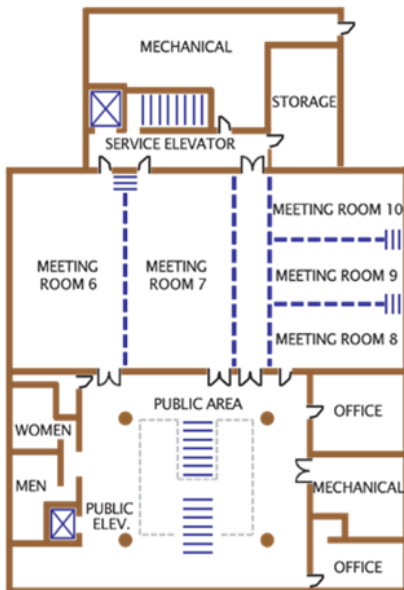

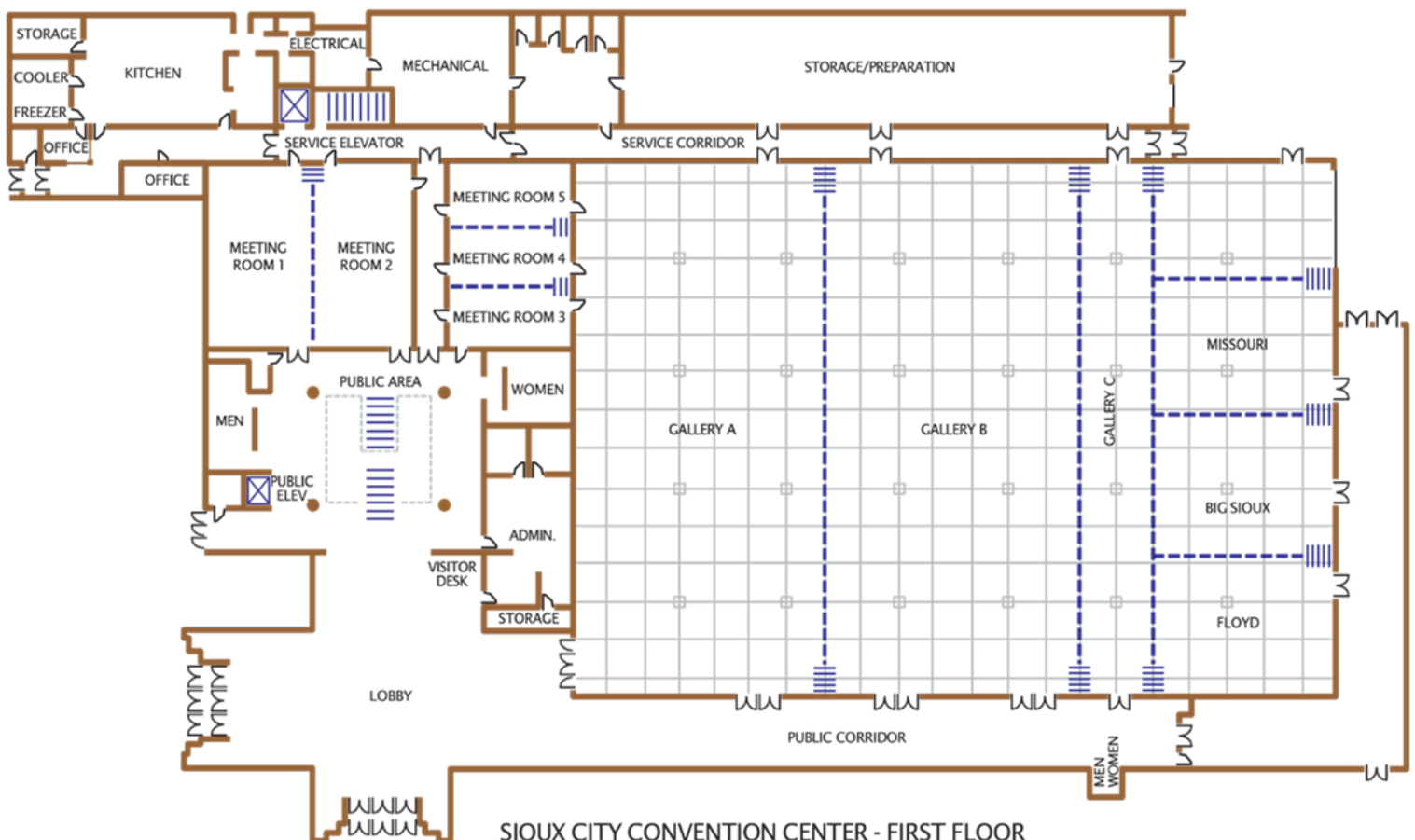

He was elected a bishop in The United Methodist Church and consecrated on July 20, 2012, at the Northeast Jurisdictional Conference. receive nutritious meals each month. Through the distribution of eyeglasses, shoes, and hygiene kits, children experience dignity, confidence, and care. Yet these programs are about more than meeting immediate needs—they are pathways to lasting transformation. Every well, every meal, and every act of compassion is part of a greater mission: offering dignity through compassionate service, hope through the Gospel, and purpose through discipleship.

As Blessman International celebrates 25 years of ministry, we invite you to become part of the story. Discover what mission engagement looks like in South Africa and see firsthand how God is transforming lives through compassionate action and Gospel-centered ministry. Every Church Plants: From Vision to Practice (Main Level Room 2)

Presenter: Rev. Zach Kingery, Upper Midwest Multiplication Team Leader

Come hear a panel of practitioners share the “why,” “how,” and lessons learned from pursuing multiplication in the Upper Midwest. This breakout will feature real stories from individuals and churches taking faithful next steps in evangelism, disciple-making, church planting, and forming new faith communities.

Together, we will explore how ordinary congregations can cultivate a culture of disciple-making and multiplication, raise up missional leaders, and take faithful next steps as we become a Conference where Every Church Plants.

Panel:

- Aldersgate in Aberdeen is the sponsor/mother church for Faith Community in Rapid City, living out the vision of Every Church Plants by supporting Faith Community through prayer, encouragement, and tangible partnership.
- Valentine Methodist, located in a community of 2,700, launched home groups that reproduced and multiplied, shifting from a church that sends people to groups to groups that evangelize, disciple, and build up the church.
- 1927 in Des Moines, a liturgically charismatic church plant that started organically and uses “Chapters,” gatherings modeled on Wesleyan class meetings, for formation and deep disciple-making.
- Rev. Jonathan Lee, who led a season of church-plant discernment in the Twin Cities area, resulting in the birth of a campus ministry at the University of Minnesota.

But we will also talk about some of the limits and potential dangers of misusing AI, and talk briefly about how we might think about the work of the Holy Spirit and AI-- for example, how could or should a pastor use it in helping create a sermon? How should a teacher use it in developing curriculum? Examples will be given.

This session is being led by a philosopher, not a tech-guru, so set your expectations appropriately-- if you've never used AI at all, you will still find the session useful I believe. If you are an AI expert, we look forward to your contribution to the discussion!

Conference Standing Rules

Organizational Resolutions and Standing Rules for Upper Midwest Conference of the Global Methodist Church.

1. Robert's Rule of Order is the primary source of parliamentary procedure employed by the Upper Midwest Conference of the Global Methodist Church.
2. The printed agenda becomes the official agenda of the Conference, with adjustments, as necessary. All requests for additional items to be placed on the agenda shall be submitted to the Conference Secretary.
3. The bar is the Main Room whether set up as tables or as an auditorium. All in attendance are invited to be seated, though only voting members both laity and clergy are given voice and vote. All votes are limited to the bar of the Conference.
4. The following persons are given both voice and vote during the business session of the Annual Conference:
 - a. Registered Lay Members of the Annual Conference who represent Global Methodist Charges or Church who are officially recorded as part of the Upper Midwest Conference of the Global Methodist Church.
 - b. Registered Clergy assigned or appointed to an official Global Methodist Charge or Church. Registered Clergy who serves in an officially recognized appointment beyond the local church. Clergy who are appointed to Senior Status and are within the first seven years of that appointed status.
5. Voting on some topics is restricted by the Book of Doctrines and Discipline of the Global Methodist Church. The presiding officer will inform the body of the Annual Conference when restrictions apply to a specific vote.
6. The presiding officer may grant other persons the right of voice during the Conference.
7. During debate or addressing the Annual Conference from the floor the speaker will state their name, church and status of laity or clergy.

Discussion returned to the Annual Conference Planning Team Report. Tom Shinkle spoke to this and asked for consideration of options. James Parks explained that the Planning Committee considered various options and is open to alternatives. At this point the plan is to have the conference continue in Sioux City for a three-year span, and for the fourth year to be held at a different location. The plan is for the conference to be held next year, June 10-12, 2027 in Aberdeen, S.D.

A discussion was followed by a vote on the location of Aberdeen, S.D. as the site for the 2027 annual conference. The motion to hold the 2027 Annual Conference in Aberdeen, S.D passed.

The Missions Team was launched just over a year ago and has spent this year setting a firm foundation for our work in the future. Our work is based on Acts 1:8, “But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth (the 10/40 Window).” Our new logo highlights this focus.

We have an active closed Facebook group where individuals and churches can find conference mission information and connect with each other to learn how other churches are in mission. Search Facebook for Upper Midwest GMC - Missions and ask to join.

We approved Blessman International (www.blessmaninternational.org)

as our first conference-endorsed mission organization, a good match for our Conference partnership with South Africa. In November 2025 fifteen lay and clergy served children and youth through many projects with Blessman International in Limpopo Province, South Africa for our first conference-sponsored mission trip. A second trip is scheduled for November 12-24, 2026. You can find information to sign up on the Blessman International website, in the conference email newsletter, or in our Facebook group.

Our biggest project is our challenge to all local churches in our conference to raise money to dig 3 wells with Blessman International at 3 preschools or day care centers in South Africa. We are confident the needed \$37,500 will be raised and God will be glorified as we celebrate digging these 3 wells for our third birthday as a Conference!

The Global Methodist Church Kingdom Advancement Commission has developed an Acts 1:8 certification to recognize churches who are in mission across the globe. Our Missions Team will be highlighting details of how your church can work toward this goal.

We are grateful to God for such strong partners and look forward to the blessings of God that he is bestowing on all of us through this partnership.

Ethnic Ministry Team Report

I am deeply grateful for the Upper Midwest Annual Conference's continued faithfulness in its commitment to ethnic ministry. We remain the only Annual Conference in the Global Methodist Church with a dedicated Committee on Ethnic Ministry. This is not merely a structural distinction—it is a reflection of the heart of the gospel.

The good news of Jesus Christ is for all people, in all places, at all times. In a world often divided by culture, language, race, and nationality, the gospel proclaims a greater truth: every person is created in the image of God and redeemed through Christ. As Scripture reminds us, *"Christ is all, and is in all"* (Colossians 3:11). Our ministry flows from this conviction—that we are one body, called to live in unity while honoring the diversity of God's kingdom.

Our Ongoing Mission

Throughout 2026, the Committee on Ethnic Ministry has continued to meet regularly, seeking to strengthen the conference's witness and effectiveness in reaching all people. Our work remains grounded in six key priorities:

1. Building Relationships

Across our large and diverse conference, we are intentionally fostering relationships among pastors, leaders, and congregations. Trust and unity begin with knowing one another well, and we continue to create spaces for connection, encouragement, and shared ministry.

2. Sharing Leadership

We are committed to expanding ethnic representation in conference leadership. Ethnic leaders are actively serving on key committees, offering valuable perspectives that enrich our collective discernment and decision-making.

3. Supporting Ethnic Churches and Pastors

We continue to walk alongside ethnic pastors and congregations, especially those facing challenges related to appointments, finances, or ministry resources. Recent conversations have highlighted that cultural preferences within local churches can still create barriers in the appointment process. In response, we are strengthening support systems and advocating for greater awareness and fairness.

4. Partnership Churches

We are encouraging partnerships between congregations to strengthen ministry and provide mutual support. These relationships foster encouragement, shared resources, and long-term sustainability for ethnic churches.

5. Education

Education remains essential to our mission. We are equipping churches and leaders with tools to understand and engage diverse communities faithfully. This includes guidance on ministry structure, leadership development, and cultural awareness—always grounded in Christ's centrality.

6. Cross-Racial/Cross-Cultural (CR/CC) Training

One of our most significant developments is the continued expansion of Cross-Racial/Cross-Cultural training. This initiative equips pastors and congregations with theological foundations and practical tools to navigate cultural differences with grace. Our goal is not simply inclusion, but transformation—learning to love, lead, and worship together as one body in Christ.

Key Developments in 2026

In addition to our ongoing priorities, several important initiatives have taken shape this year:

- **Multi-Ethnic Fellowship Growth** We are encouraged by the growing fellowship among ethnic pastors across the United States. These gatherings provide prayer, encouragement, and unity in shared mission. Plans are underway to strengthen communication through a dedicated Facebook group and regular gatherings.
- **Ethnic Ministry Newsletter** We have launched both conference-wide and internal newsletters to improve communication, visibility, and connection. Each month, we highlight the ministries of ethnic pastors, sharing their stories, challenges, and testimonies of God's work.
- **Pastor Care and Support Initiatives** The committee is developing a Pastor Well-being Support Fund to respond to real and urgent needs among ethnic pastors and their families. This includes support for medical crises, financial hardship, and ministry-related challenges. Our vision is to reflect the love of Christ by caring for one another as one spiritual family.

Annual Conference Ethnic Gathering We continue to organize gatherings during Annual Conference that include worship, testimonies, and prayer. These moments strengthen unity and celebrate the diversity of God's work among us.

Looking Ahead

We recognize that challenges remain. Appointment processes, cultural barriers, and resource limitations continue to affect ethnic pastors and congregations. However, we are encouraged by the work God is doing among us.

Ethnic ministry is not about division—it is about the church more fully reflecting the kingdom of God. As we move forward, we remain committed to being a conference that welcomes, supports, and empowers all people to serve Christ. May we continue to grow as one body—united in mission, diverse in expression, and faithful to the gospel.

Multiplication Team Report

Every Church Plants

Mission & Vision

The Multiplication Team operates with authorization of the Annual Conference to “*encourage and facilitate the planting of new churches, including the authorization of sponsorship by existing congregations, and to charter such new congregations*” (¶¶ 439.17, 450, 709.3), and has the overall goal of seeing all healthy congregations in the conference actively participating in multiplication.

Our Mission is to see our communities have Bible believing, Spirit-led congregations committed to making disciples of Jesus Christ and spreading scriptural holiness across the globe.

Our Vision: Every church is instrumental and every leader effective in making disciples who make disciples who are actively on mission for Jesus.

Because of the mission and vision our goal is simple: **Every church plants.**

In order to have healthy congregations of all sizes participating in church planting and multiplication by the year 2030 key areas of focus have been identified:

- discernment through fasting and prayer
- renewed missionary zeal for the gospel
- paradigm shift in the expression of church by adopting an essential ecclesiology
- reorienting from pastoral dependency to the ‘pastorhood’ of all believers
- deliverance from dead discipleship practices.

Plainly stated, the Multiplication Team exists to encourage and facilitate new faith communities, church planting and multiplication across the Upper Midwest Conference. This means helping all our congregations, regardless of size, move toward faithful participation in the Great Commission so we will become a Conference where Every Church Plants.

But “Every Church Plants” is not a single model. It is a shared identity and direction: disciples making disciples who make disciples, leaders who raise up and send leaders, and churches who plant churches.

Key Progress and Updates

From vision statement to “operating system.”

The team has aligned around a focused aim: turning the Every Church Plants vision into a clear, repeatable process. This requires contextual tools, training pathways, consistent follow-through, and key partnerships

that move congregations toward health, evangelism, discipling, sending, and planting.

Shifting Culture with Resources and Rhythm

We are building momentum toward change through repeatable conference-wide rhythms that keep the Every Church Plants vision in front of clergy and laity and translate it into simple local church language. These rhythms are part of how we are shaping a common culture of discipleship, leadership apprenticeship, and sending:

Multiplication Articles + Multiplication Minute – Ongoing communication that reinforces key themes (health → mission → multiplication), shares practical local-church application, and builds a growing resource bank to equip congregations. *Check out these resources and get connected at:*
Uppermidwestgmc.org/multiplication

Presiding Elder Multiplier Equipping – A strategic shift in 2026 has been moving from broad inspiration to scalable field-level training through Presiding Elders, with quarterly equipping built into cabinet meeting structures for consistency and follow-through.

NextGen Pipeline: “The Call” – In March, Rev. Zach Kingery co-led with Rev. Mike Morgan a prototype NextGen retreat titled “The Call,” designed to encourage teenagers to encounter, discern, and respond to God’s calling. Approximately twenty High School age students engaged in teaching, small-group discussion, vocational and marketplace testimonies, and spiritual gifts exploration. This is a culture-shaping rhythm because it strengthens the long-term leadership pipeline for ministry, mission, and multiplication - and it is intended to be refined and replicated across the Conference.

Planting and New Faith Community Developments

Des Moines: 1927 began with a group of six praying and studying the 27th Psalm. Led by Cam Scott, this growing congregation is now preparing to launch public worship in August 2026. Envisioning their church as a garden in the middle of a parking lot, 1927 is built around a simple movement of Presence → Formation → Mission, where prayer, worship, and intentional discipleship in small communities called Chapters equip believers to live as a faithful witness in everyday life.

Twin Cities: Discernment around a potential church plant location resulted in the birth of a growing college ministry at the University of Minnesota. Led by Rev. Jonathan Lee, what started as a bible study is now progressing toward the ecclesial markers of a church with believers gathering where the Word of God is faithfully preached and the people are organized for worship and discipleship. Seeing a church planted in Brooklyn Center of the Twin Cities still burns in Jonathan’s heart while he also has begun exploring how this ministry at UofM might become a multiplying model for campus discipleship and future church planting among young adults and future leaders.

Leadership Development and Culture of Call

If the Upper Midwest is to become a Conference where Every Church Plants, we must build a stronger pipeline of called and disciplined leaders.

This matters because multiplication is not primarily a funding problem or a creativity problem - it is often a leadership and discipleship pipeline problem. We are issuing the challenge that every pastor and local church identifies and develops two emerging leaders annually and we are working to equip you so that challenge can be achieved.

Budget

Current Budget: \$30,000 + \$10,000 pledge Covenantal giving

Proposed Budget: \$66,000

Looking Ahead

As we look toward 2030, the Multiplication Team will continue focusing on:

1. Health-first multiplication: keeping discipling and evangelism at the center of our ongoing efforts to be a Conference where “Every Church Plants.”
2. Training the trainers: strengthening Presiding Elder equipping and practical toolkits that pastors and leadership groups can immediately implement.
3. Equipping Clergy and Laity: leveraging strategic and effective gatherings and resources to inspire, equip, and mobilize all in our Conference willing to be disciples who make disciples who make disciples. Gatherings like Exponential Central and Global as well as cohorts such as the Exponential MLC.
4. Developing clear chartering pathway: so new works can move from early formation into stable, accountable conference life with clarity and integrity.

Contextual models for participation: helping every congregation take a next step (prayer, giving, leader development, partnership, sending, microchurch expressions, and more).

Encouraging Closing Vision

We are grateful for the faithful work already happening across the Upper Midwest and see the significant opportunity ahead. The harvest truly is plentiful. Let us be committed not only to the chores of the church but even more so to the work in the fields.

With a commitment to spiritual and functional health, to raising up leaders, and to becoming disciples who know they are missionaries to where we live, learn, work, and play, God will shape us into a Conference where Every Church Plants.

General Conference 2026 Delegation

GENERAL CONFERENCE DELEGATION REPORT

The General Conference Delegation elected by the Annual Conference last year has been meeting monthly to prepare for General Conference 2026 in South Africa. These meetings have included delegates, alternates, and reserves. While only delegates and alternates are officially sent by the conference to General Conference, reserves and guests may attend on their own.

One responsibility of the delegation has been the discernment of episcopal nominees. The delegation nominated one person from outside our conference, Rev. Forbes Matonga of Zimbabwe. We did not nominate anyone from within our conference this time. The delegation also elected Rev. Ross Reinhiller and Becky Heeren to serve on our Area Episcopacy Committee. They will work with leaders from the other conferences in our episcopal area to rank the top five candidates for episcopal leadership for the next six years.

Our episcopal area includes the conferences of Central Nigeria, South Carolina, Peru, Florida, South Africa, and the Upper Midwest. At General Conference, one bishop will be appointed to serve these six conferences.

The delegation has also spent significant time reviewing the Book of Doctrines and Discipline. We sought to better understand the guidance it provides and identify places where additional clarity may be helpful. A strong team worked together to develop more than twenty petitions for consideration by the delegation. After prayerful discussion and discernment, the delegation approved a number of these petitions to be submitted for consideration at General Conference.

In the months leading up to General Conference, the delegation will continue reviewing and discussing the petitions that will come before the conference.

Because this is only our second General Conference, there has been significant learning throughout the process. The delegation has worked to establish processes that may serve future delegations as well. Throughout this work, there has been a shared desire to ensure that the Book of Doctrines and Discipline serves the local church in fulfilling the mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ and spreading scriptural holiness across the globe.

Please continue praying for the delegation as we complete our preparations and make plans for travel to South Africa. Above all, may God be glorified in this work.

Cabinet Report

Our task is to shepherd, connect, and equip the pastors and churches of our conference. This work is especially carried out through the appointment process and will continue to grow through our broader focus on making disciples of Jesus Christ.

This spring, the Cabinet participated in training through the International Leadership Institute's disciple-making process, *History Makers*. Each presiding elder, along with additional conference leaders, completed the first module. The second module will take place this fall. One of the strengths of this process is that those who are trained become trainers themselves, and our hope is to see this model spread throughout the conference.

This fall, Conference Vice-Superintendent Rev. Ross Reinhiller will conclude his appointment at Faith Methodist Church in Williston, North Dakota. We celebrate the ministry that has taken place there and are praying for a smooth transition in pastoral leadership for the church. Rev. Reinhiller will continue serving the conference in his role as Conference Vice-Superintendent.

Presiding Elder Rev. Bruce Smith has also received a new appointment and will be stepping away from his role as presiding elder. With one fewer presiding elder serving the conference, we would like to experiment with a new form of connection in southeast Iowa. The Southeast District will be organized into circuits of approximately five churches each. A Circuit Leader will be identified to lead each group and maintain connection with a presiding elder. One circuit will connect with the Northeast Presiding Elder, and another with the South Central Presiding Elder. We will evaluate whether this structure may also be beneficial in other areas of the conference.

Another transition among the presiding elders will take place in the Southeast South Dakota District. Rev. Joleen Pietrzak has requested time out of the presiding elder role, so adjustments will be made in this district's leadership as well.

Please continue to pray for your presiding elders as many of them serve their local church and the conference in this vital ministry.

Disaster Response Team Report

The Upper Midwest Conference has been blessed in the last year that we have not had to respond to any major disasters within the Conference. There have been localized weather events and fires that local response volunteers have been able to cover. We have had some localized weather events that chainsaw teams have responded to, as well as some wild fires where livestock feed has been purchased.

Nationally we have responded with financial support to major weather events that happened in Texas and in many of the Southeast Conferences. Most of our financial support is not recorded in the Conference as we compel churches to give directly to our ministry partners who are serving in the affected regions. The Conference did receive almost \$9,000.00 that was sent to responders of the tragic flooding in Texas.

This last year has been a time of preparation in Global Methodist Church Disaster Response throughout our nation and in the world. We have streamlined processes where financial support and teams are able to be employed faster and more directly into these needed areas. To begin with the Conference Disaster Coordinators have established a pathway for communication that is available real time. This will result in individual Conference Disaster Coordinators to then communicate with their Conference churches specific needs. Disasters will be labeled under three categories. Level one- localized disaster- to be handled locally... Level two- regional disaster requesting help from regional sources. This could be from other areas within the conference to neighboring conferences. Level three is a significant event that recalls assistance from all within our connection... These disasters are beyond regional abilities and request financial and hands on support from our entire connection. In the last year we as a connection have responded in Texas and Southeast in America, Jamaica, Philippines, and several issues in Africa.

To be involved in disaster ministry as a conference we have two requests.

- 1) Pay attention to conference communications and the website to see where the needs are right now that your church might respond.
- 2) To have a special collection to build Conference Disaster Funds for immediate response to disaster areas, near and far, while communication is concluded seeking individual church response.

Jethro Project Report

Jethro, though not a prominent figure in Scripture, blessed God's people through his seasoned experience and insight. As the Upper Midwest Conference grows towards the vital organization necessary for the Kingdom building work to which it is called, assistance in pastoral and congregational encouragement, support, coaching, wisdom and prayer is offered by the Senior Members of the Conference.

The "Jethro Project" presents the following report of our activity for the Conference Year 2025-2026.

1. The **Pastor and Congregation Prayer** project has paired a "Senior Member" with a District to: pray daily for every pastor and their congregation in their district and directly contact each pastor periodically to listen, encourage and pray with them. Pastors have received this well and all of our Districts are being ministered to in this way.
2. Retreats led by the Jethro Project entitled "**Let's be Methodist Together**" were held at Prairie Creek Church in Grimes, IA, Cornerstone Community in Watertown, SD and Camp Comeca near Cozad, NE. The retreat was constructed for the purpose of connecting clergy together and encouraging them to imbed "Methodism" in the DNA of their congregations. All the districts desiring the experience have been served.
3. One important outcome of the "Let's be Methodist Together" retreat was the consistent evaluation regarding our clergy not being connected with each other. This led to the request of Conference Leadership to join with us in building the event promoted at the "**Leadership Encounter**" for laity and clergy to be held prior to the Annual Conference session in Sioux City at Wesley GMC. Our prayer is that this event will be the next step in connecting our Global Methodists in Bands or other supporting groups.
4. Our first in person meeting of "Senior Members" was held one early morning during the Annual Conference session 2025. Thirty-one "Senior" or near Senior members gathered for Conversation and encouragement.
5. "Jethroe's" continue to minister in ways that support the Annual Conference and the local church, including filling pulpits, teaching classes and seminars, leading consultations and offering prayer, support, wisdom and encouragement to pastors and congregations in the Upper Midwest Conference.

Strategic Planning Team Report

Our Conference Mission: To lovingly walk alongside laity and clergy as they make disciples of Jesus Christ who worship passionately, love extravagantly, and witness boldly.

Our Conference Vision: Every church is instrumental, and every leader is effective in sharing the saving and transforming Good News of Jesus Christ.

The Strategic Planning Team was formed at the encouragement of Bishop Webb to work alongside the Conference Superintendent in discerning the priorities of the Upper Midwest Conference. This team brings a variety of perspectives and gifts as we seek to prayerfully listen for where God is leading us next.

Through this process, the team has discerned three key priorities for our shared future:

1. Raising the next generation of leaders
 2. Developing Wesleyan leaders
- Cultivating a culture of church planting in every congregation

These priorities build on one another and are grounded in a strong foundation: empowered and equipped laity in our local churches faithfully living out God's call.

Raising the Next Generation of Leaders

To raise the next generation, we must cultivate a culture of calling within our local churches. We believe God has a call on every believer's life, and heaven rejoices whenever that call is answered. As a conference, we want to help individuals recognize and respond to that call earlier and more clearly.

This will require creating intentional pathways that connect young people to the life and ministry of the Upper Midwest Conference. One example is *The Call*, a pilot retreat for 10th–12th grade students discerning God's direction. Designed by young people for young people, this experience helped equip 22 student leaders.

Moving forward, we will continue developing pathways through camping and campus ministries to further guide and disciple these emerging leaders.

Developing Wesleyan Leaders

We remain deeply rooted in our Wesleyan heritage—being Spirit-led, Scripture-centered, and reliant on grace as we pursue holiness together. This formation happens through intentional discipleship, including small groups (bands) and active engagement in acts of mercy.

As a conference, we are setting a goal that by 2030 every church will identify two emerging leaders each year. These leaders will be invited into accessible and effective equipping processes to help them live into God's call. While some will be called to ordained ministry, many will serve as lay leaders who will shape and lead the future of our churches.

This vision will also require seasoned mentors who are willing to invest in and walk alongside these emerging leaders.

Cultivating a Culture of Multiplication

As we raise and equip leaders, we believe God will grow a healthy and multiplying body of Christ. With that growth comes the call to multiply.

We envision a conference where every church participates in church planting, through prayer, partnership, and sending. As disciples make disciples, new communities of faith will be needed where people can gather, grow, and be sent out again.

Multiplication will require deep prayer, surrender to the Holy Spirit, and strong support from our local congregations.

If you feel called to invest in these priorities, we invite you to connect with your presiding elder or conference superintendent. Together, we can step forward in faith and participate in what God is doing across the Upper Midwest Conference.

Superintendency Committee Report

Rev. James Parks is our Conference Superintendent who also serves the Marion Church in Marion, Iowa. Rev. Ross Reinhiller is our Conference Vice Superintendent and serves the Faith Church in Williston, ND, too. Both of our superintendents serve the conference and their respective congregations part-time. This kind of structure is rather unique in the GMC. Because of the geographical size of our conference, this leadership model seems to be working for us.

We are blessed by James’ and Ross’ servant leadership style, and their spiritual gifts and personalities complement one another creating a strong leadership team for us. In the fall of 2025, Bishop Webb taught the committee about the GMC evaluation process. We identified many strengths between the two gentlemen. We also identified growth areas that they can strengthen through continuing education and leadership experiences.

In January, Pastor Jake Schadel, who was the chair of the committee, resigned to join the Multiplication Team. Pastor Sheri Fadley became the interim chair. She has been learning a lot about conference level ministry over the past six months. The committee met twice: February and April. The current plan is for them to meet four times a year.

Each month the chair connects with James and Ross and sends out prayer prompts to the committee members to cover James and Ross and their responsibilities and their lives in Christ in prayer. Other ways the committee can fulfill their responsibilities to the conference and to James and Ross is by monitoring social media platforms to be aware of positive and negative interactions; watching their worship services; and being available to members of the Upper Midwest GMC conference for their feedback.

James and Ross are supported with administrative help by Shanna Pinkerton, who has been working part-time for the conference as well. With our conference growth, our staffing needs have changed, and the committee and our leaders believe it is necessary for Shanna to work full-time for us.

For the past three years, James and Ross have led our conference selflessly mastering the art of juggling not only responsibilities for the conference and their churches, but also for the larger GMC. Having two General Conferences in the past 3 years has added much into their already full lives with Christ. Please keep them in your prayers, asking the Holy Spirit to inspire them, to provide them with insight and wisdom, and to sustain their spirits in these demanding roles.

I also ask you to pray for the superintendency committee as we continue to grow in our understanding and ability to serve the Upper Midwest GMC conference and to support James and Ross as our leaders. We are all called to live out the Conference mission and vision statements.

Conference Planning Team Report

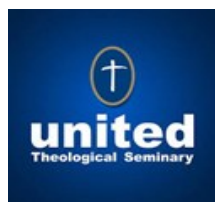

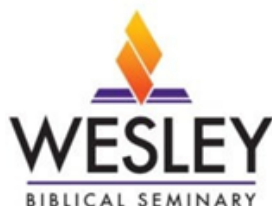

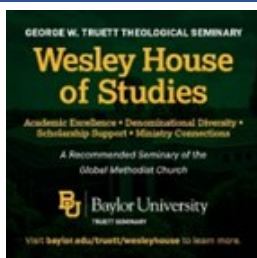
