Eyes Will Open, Children Will Drink

*Then God opened her eyes and she saw a well of water.
So, she filled the skin with water and gave the boy a drink.*

Genesis 21:19

Last November we hosted the first Conference Mission Trip to South Africa. The time spent with Blessman International was packed with opportunity. Folks across our Conference from Iowa to Montana experienced and participated in ministries of mercy: feeding children and distributing food to outreach stations, caring for orphan infants, working in eye clinics, and empowering young women in hygiene so that there is consistent school attendance.

One ministry in which the Mission team participated was the drilling of a water well at a nursery school and the instillation of an irrigation system for the school's garden. Having a reliable source of water and the extension of food security allows the nursery school to increase the number of children and by extension their families.

When the drill hit the vein and the cat- aract of water shot into the air the whole school erupted in celebration. My mind went to the story of Hagar and Ishmael's expulsion from Abraham's family. When Abraham sent his son away, he provided enough water for the start of the journey but not enough for survival. When the water was gone and the days stretched with heat, Hagar set her son aside and cried out to the Lord. God heard the cry and provided a well of water.

I wondered how many South African parents have cried out to God. Opening the eyes of those parents God showed them a well providing for their children. The means of the miracle is us. The Mis- sions Team of our Conference is challeng- ing us to drill at least three new water wells in South Africa. We will hear more directly from the Missions Team but for now, get ready to be the answer to many family's prayers!

Eyes will open and children will drink!



MULTIPLICATION TEAM UPDATE

Healthy Leaders for a Multiplying Conference

"By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples." John 15:8

As we begin a new year, many churches set goals, re- fine calendars, and plan initiatives. But if we are serious about becoming an Annual Conference where Every Church Plants, we must begin at a deeper level. Multi- plication does not start with strategies or structures, it starts with spiritual health and spiritual health only comes from being connected to the Vine: Jesus Christ.

Healthy multiplication flows from healthy pastors, healthy leadership groups, and healthy disciple-making congregations that are evangelistic and missional at their core. Without health at these levels, churches may grow larger, but they rarely reproduce.

Across North America, committed believers, especially younger generations, are increasingly frustrated with programmatic, consumer-driven church models. National research from Discipleship.org and Exponential reveals a sobering reality: 95% of churches do not have a disciple-making culture, and 93% are not reproducing. Even more concerning, many leaders overestimate their effectiveness while relying on systems optimized for consumption rather than reproduction.

Why does this matter?

Because multiplication is the fruit of healthy reproduction, and healthy reproduction requires spiritually healthy, mission-focused leaders.

A pastor who is spiritually depleted will struggle to lead others into a life centered on Jesus and attentive to the Spirit. A leadership council focused on maintenance will rarely discern God's call to send. A church without a missional disciple-making culture unintentionally trains people to attend rather than obey.

The Right Questions Make a Difference

Health is not abstract. It can be prayerfully discerned by asking honest, mission-centered questions. As pastors and local church leaders enter 2026, consider asking these questions monthly, not to shame, but to lovingly hold one another accountable to the Great Commission:

- Who have you personally shared Christ with in the past three months, and how are you following up?
- Who are you intentionally discipling with the expectation that they will disciple someone else?
- Who are you investing in to replace your leadership role?
- What new ministries outside the walls of the church have recently been launched by laypeople?
- How soon do we believe God is calling our church to help plant another church?

These are not performance metrics. They are missional markers that help us discern whether we are maintaining ministry or actively participating in Christ's mission.

Abide and Bear Fruit

Being a healthy multiplier begins in the interior life and extends into the shared life of the church. When pastors are healthy, leadership groups discern together, and disciples are equipped to live on mission, multiplication becomes natural.

This year, invest intentionally in spiritual health. Ask honest questions. Listen for the Holy Spirit. Nail preferences and worldly comfort to the cross, and take steps of faithful obedience.

As we move toward Conference-wide health by 2030, I truly believe that God will shape us into a multiplying movement – one where Every Church Plants.



Year End Statistics

As we celebrate the New Year, let us also celebrate all that God has done this past year in the Upper Midwest Conference!

We ask that someone from each church take a few minutes to gather the information for the questions listed on next page and then submit it via the 2025 End of Year Statistical Form.

Here are the Questions on the Form:

1. Total number of Professing Members.
2. Total number of Baptisms (Baptisms in 2025, not counting remembrances of baptism).
3. Total Professions of Faith (New members who joined not by transfer from another church).
4. Average In-person Worship Attendance of Your Primary Services (Only count those in the service).
5. Average Households Who Worship Online (Number of views over a minute the week the service was live).
6. Number of Adults Involved In Classes, Bands, Accountability Groups and Small Groups (Not total attendance, but individuals involved).
7. Average Attendance of Youth in Discipleship Ministries (Ages 12-18).
8. Average Attendance of Kids in Discipleship Ministries (Ages 0-11).
9. Number of People Serving in Missions (Mission trips, Compassion and Evangelism Ministries with a purpose of serving people not connected to the local church, etc.).
10. Total Operating Income.

This report is a time to celebrate and document all the ways God has shown up, shown out, and exceeded your expectations this past year.
