


Convention Center Site Map



Bio: Mark J. Webb currently serves as a bishop in The Global Methodist Church.



He was elected a bishop in The United Methodist Church and consecrated on July 20, 2012, at the Northeast Jurisdictional Conference. Mark served as the episcopal leader of the Upper New York Area of the United Methodist Church from September 1, 2012, until December 31, 2022. On January 2, 2023, he was received as an elder and bishop in The Global Methodist Church.

Mark holds a M. Div. from Asbury Theological Seminary and a Bachelor of Arts in Sociology from Shippensburg University. He also holds a graduate certificate in nonprofit management from the University of Connecticut.

He served pastorates at Aldersgate United Methodist Church, Mechanicsburg, Pa. from 1994-2007, St. Paul's United Methodist Church, Wormleysburg, Pa. from 1991-1994, and Linglestown United Methodist Church from 1989-1991. He served as District Superintendent of the York District of the Susquehanna Conference of the United Methodist Church from 2007-2012.

Mark currently serves as a Trustee of United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio

He received the Harry Denman Evangelism Award in 2002 and in 2018, was named as one of the top 100 leaders by the John C. Maxwell Transformational Leadership Award.

Mark encourages clergy and laity to work together in the development of discipleship pathways that will point people to Jesus Christ and bear fruit for the kingdom of God. He has a passion for Christ-following leadership development, new faith communities and ensuring existing congregations grow in vitality and fulfill the mission of “making disciples of Jesus Christ who worship passionately, love extravagantly and witness boldly”.

Finance and the Church Leader (Main Level Room 1)

Dirt Roads Network Spirit & Strategy: Creating a Culture of Discernment and Active Discipleship (Main Level Room 1)

What if the first step toward church multiplication wasn't strategy, but worship and discernment? This breakout explores how to form a discernment group—a small team of leaders committed to seeking God's will together for the sake of active discipleship and multiplication. Rooted in Scripture and Wesleyan tradition, you'll gain both theological grounding and practical steps for creating a Spirit-led culture in your church leadership. Through guided conversation and reflection, we'll examine how to shift from passive leadership to missional action. Whether you lead a rural church, a circuit, or a larger congregation, multiplication can begin by simply praying, "Speak Lord, your servants are listening."

Kidmin Upgrade: Practical Ways to Reach Kids: (Main Level Room 2)

Presenter: Sharon Stratmoen

Have you noticed? Kids today are dope...fire...and all the other new words they say! They're inquisitive, full of energy, tech savvy, and oh so witty and fun. Perhaps you've also observed that tried-and-true teaching techniques don't quite engage your class like they once did. In this workshop, we'll help you upgrade your teaching methodology so you can deliver Bible truths that truly sync with kids' hearts and lives. Expect practical takeaways and simple ideas that'll help you more effectively disciple the children in your care.

Disaster Response Training (Main Level Rooms 3/4/5)

The training program is broken into three parts, depending on the responsibilities that you feel called to. There will also be special training for some specialized worksites and responsibilities like Chainsaw, Assessment, and Case Work. All responders are asked to participate in Training #101.

Hospitality sets the stage and creates meaningful, life-changing moments that go beyond a simple greeting. As you join us for this session on hospitality, you'll learn how it's about making people feel valued, building genuine connections and setting a high standard of excellence. The ultimate purpose of hospitality is to create an environment where guests feel welcomed and loved, so they are open to the truth of God's Word. When we go the extra mile, we show others they matter, and through that, we create space for God to move in their lives. Hospitality is a powerful tool to transform hearts and lead people toward Jesus.

Join us as we discuss how to engage in global missions. Since 2001, Blessman International has been ministering to the impoverished children of the Limpopo province of South Africa. Today, they strive to meet the desperate physical needs the children in this region have, to gain the opportunity to speak to their great spiritual need for Jesus Christ. Learn about the newest Global Methodist Church in South Africa, Hope Church. Hear also about child sponsorship, community development, and a robust feeding program in Southern Africa that are reaching tens of thousands of children with the good news and impacting eternity for the Kingdom of God.

Conference Standing Rules

Organizational Resolutions and Standing Rules for Upper Midwest Conference of the Global Methodist Church, 2nd Session.

1. Robert's Rule of Order is the primary source of parliamentary procedure employed by the 2nd Session of the Upper Midwest Conference of the Global Methodist Church.
2. The printed agenda becomes the official agenda of the Conference, with adjustments, as necessary. All requests for additional items to be placed on the agenda shall be submitted to the Conference Secretary.
3. The bar is the Main Room whether set up as tables or as an auditorium. All in attendance are invited to be seated, though only voting members both laity and clergy are given voice and vote. All votes are limited to the bar of the Conference.
4. The following persons are given both voice and vote during the business session of the Annual Conference:
 - a. Registered Lay Members of the Annual Conference who represent Global Methodist Charges or Church who are officially recorded as part of the Upper Midwest Conference of the Global Methodist Church.
 - b. Registered Clergy assigned or appointed to an official Global Methodist Charge or Church. Registered Clergy who serves in an officially recognized appointment beyond the local church. Clergy who are appointed to Senior Status and are within the first seven years of that appointed status.
5. Voting on some topics is restricted by the Book of Doctrines and Discipline of the Global Methodist Church. The presiding officer will inform the body of the Annual Conference when restrictions apply to a specific vote.
6. The presiding officer may grant other persons the right of voice during the Conference.
7. During debate or addressing the Annual Conference from the floor the speaker will state their name, church and status of laity or clergy.

General Conference Delegates

Protocol for the election of General Conference Delegates

General Conference delegates will be elected by the 2025 Annual Conference.

- a. 5 laity delegates and 5 clergy delegates, 1 lay alternate delegate and 1 clergy alternate delegate. Reserves will be elected as well.
- b. The election of lay delegates is voted on by all laity. The election of clergy delegates is elected by the ordained clergy members of the Annual Conference.
- c. Election will be by simple majority of valid votes cast of the current ballot.
- d. First ballot candidates for election will be the persons who have submitted a valid nomination.
- e. Subsequent ballots will be cast until the full slate of delegates, alternate delegates and reserve delegates are duly elected.
 - i. The fourth ballot will consist of all candidates receiving seven or more votes cast of the third ballot.
 - ii. New candidates may be added to ballot if the candidate receives seven valid votes on the prior ballot

Every Church Plants

Mission & Vision

The Multiplication Team operates with authorization of the Annual Conference to “encourage and facilitate the planting of new churches, including the authorization of sponsorship by existing congregations, and to charter such new congregations” (¶¶ 439.17, 450, 709.3), and has the overall goal of seeing all healthy congregations in the conference actively participating in multiplication.

Our Mission is to see our communities have Bible believing, Spirit-led congregations committed to making disciples of Jesus Christ and spreading scriptural holiness across the globe.

Our Vision: Every church is instrumental and every leader effective in making disciples who make disciples who are actively on mission for Jesus.

Because of the mission and vision our goal is simple: **Every church plants.**

In order to have healthy congregations of all sizes participating in church planting and multiplication by the year 2030 key areas of focus have been identified:

- discernment through fasting and prayer
- renewed missionary zeal for the gospel.
- paradigm shift in the expression of church by adopting an essential ecclesiology.
- reorienting from pastoral dependency to the ‘pastorhood’ of all believers
- deliverance from dead discipleship practices.

Laying the Groundwork for 2030

The heartbeat of our work is to shift the DNA of our Conference through working with our local congregations. This is not just about planting churches - it's about developing a multiplying culture.

Shifting Culture with Resources and Rhythms

We are building momentum toward change through regular rhythms of encouragement and equipping:

- **Multiplication Minute** – A video posted to the Conference Facebook page the 1st Monday each month with multiplication concepts to be applied at the local level as well as interviews with multipliers.

- **Multiplication Articles** – Featured in the Conference Newsletter, highlighting best practices, inspiration for local church leaders, and creating a resource bank to equip your congregation as they develop missional practices.
- **Multiplier Zoom Calls** – Hosted on the 3rd Saturday at 10 AM each month, these 1 hour calls for clergy and laity encourage peer-to-peer learning, collaborative leadership, and cast the vision of multiplication.

ACTION ITEMS:

For this multiplying culture to spread and resources to effectively be utilized we must be connected at a local level.

- Raise up one layperson per district to organize a Multiplication Discernment Group, working alongside the Multiplication Team to inform and activate their district.

In partnership with Dirt Roads Network, Renewal Training was offered to our New Church Starts to equip the pastors and leadership groups with the tools, mindset, and spiritual disciplines for long-term missional impact. The 9-session cohort met October 2024 to March 2025 and guided churches through the dynamics of spiritual discernment, spiritual leadership development, and mission-focused planning for community transformation.

Taking New Ground

While shifting the overall DNA of our Conference will require intentional renewal and revitalization within existing congregations, we must also remain deeply committed to birthing new beginnings.

Planting

- **Des Moines - 1927**

1927 is in its pre-launch phase as a church plant. Led by Cam Scott, 1927 has moved from exploration and initial discernment to now gathering in small groups as they continue to discern and refine the vision God has given them to take new ground and reach unreached people in the Des Moines Metro area.

As they continue moving forward, led by Holy Spirit, the time will soon come when the call will go out for widespread prayer support and resourcing.

- Twin Cities

A discernment group has been gathered for prayer to discern a potential plant in the Twin Cities area of Minnesota. The group gathered weekly for a dedicated hour of prayer and listening. Rev. Jonathan Lee discerned a holy burden to begin plant exploration in Brooklyn Center this summer while also beginning outreach at the University of Minnesota this fall.

Growing

- Faith Community Church

Launched with 20 people in July 2023 with a vision to embody faithful, Spirit-led community, Faith Community Church is a New Church Start in Rapid City that has outgrown their current gathering space, now averaging over 70+ in weekly attendance. They are currently discerning their next location to accommodate their growing congregation as they reach new people for Christ.

A building fund has been established, and we are putting out the call to every congregation in our Conference: *Will you prayerfully consider what the Lord is calling your church to give toward this Kingdom-building endeavor?* Together, we can help provide a gathering space for this vibrant congregation.

Creating A Culture of Call

As the GMC Kingdom Advancement Commission and Rev. Steve Cordle (GMC Director of Church Multiplication) cast movement wide vision and guidance, we are committed not only to following recommended pathways but also to pioneering new and forgotten ways of advancing the Kingdom. We believe our Conference can become a model where churches plant churches and the next generation of leaders is formed through grassroots disciple-making movements.

The Multiplication Team invites every pastor, church, and layperson (of all ages) to engage this movement. *The future of our mission lies not first in strategy, but in surrender - in becoming a people who live as missionaries.*

Let us press on together toward the day when **Every Church Plants.**

Prayer & Intercession Team Report

The 2024 Annual Conference defines the Role of The Conference Prayer & Intercession Team as follows: "The role of The Conference Prayer & Intercession Team is to ensure the work of the emerging Conference is thoroughly covered in prayer throughout the developmental process and beyond." The team prays for regional leadership and regional needs as well as the Global Methodist Church leadership and needs. This Conference team also prays and works together to encourage local Global Methodist Church pastors to prayerfully select a prayer point person from each local church to ensure prayer is a priority in local churches. The Conference Prayer & Intercession team encourages churches to become a "house of prayer." The team also resources local churches as needed. Most importantly, the team prays for the mission of the Upper Midwest Conference: "To lovingly walk alongside laity and clergy as they make disciples of Jesus Christ and spread scriptural holiness across the globe."

- We have members from Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota, and South Dakota districts. We have been gathering monthly via Zoom on the first Monday at 7:30 PM (CT).
- We received overwhelmingly positive feedback from the 2024 Annual Conference delegates for the Prayer Team ministry, such as "I/we never experienced the presence of God so tangibly at the Annual Conference before" and "I felt amazing peace that I was at God's house." Thanks to the prayer team members for their ministry and the Conference Planning team for including three prayer times in the Conference agenda schedule. Above all, thank God for His presence in our midst. We plan to provide a "Prayer Station" at the Conference where the delegates freely come and pray at any time. Our team will pray for those who request prayer during break times.
- Our team writes an article for the Conference's monthly newsletter to share prayer points and encourage churches to pray. We hope our articles remind churches of the importance of prayer for the spiritual lives of individuals and churches.
- We provided information for over 20 books on/about prayer on the Conference website for the church to use as a resource.
- We provide a 45-second daily prayer for all in our Conference so that we may all pray the same.
- We provided prayers for Lent, Palm Sunday, Good Friday, and Easter in 2025 for the Conference article and Facebook.
- Last year, we passed out 400 World Prayer Maps (from EveryHome.org) at the Annual Conference. The delegates wanted more, so we prepared the map to distribute again this year, hoping the churches would pray for all nations; without Jesus, the world is broken.
- We pray for all aspects of the ministries and the pastors of our Conference, the GMC, and national and international concerns. We have additional meetings to plan the prayer ministry. We also support the GMC's prayer ministry when they call special 40 days of prayers.
- We plan to survey the churches this coming year to learn the prayer ministry condition of the church so that we can effectively support and encourage the churches' prayer ministry, be connected, and work closer together as one body.

- We have been praying for the following concerns:
 - That prayer becomes an essential ministry in every church, so that our churches may truly become houses of prayer.
 - For God’s wisdom, insight, and guidance for the bishops and pastors of our Conferences.
 - For an outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and for revival and renewal in all churches within our Conference, the Global Methodist Church (GMC), the United States, and around the world.
 - For the effectiveness and wellbeing of pastors, as well as clear vision and unity for our churches.
 - For God’s blessings upon our church planting ministries and youth ministries.
 - For God’s grace and mercy upon those suffering from natural disasters.
 - For the General Conference and the election of General Conference delegates.

I thank God for all the prayer team members who have faithfully served in this manner. We cannot fulfill the Great Commandment and the Great Commission without Prayer and Intercession. As history tells us, revivals of the church and fruitful evangelism and mission happen upon prayer, so is PRAYER not what we desperately need today?

Ethnic Ministry Team Report

I am deeply grateful for the Upper Midwest Annual Conference's ongoing faithfulness. We remain the only Annual Conference in the Global Methodist Church (GMC) to have a dedicated Committee on Ethnic Ministry. This is a testimony to our collective commitment to reflecting the beautiful diversity of God's Kingdom. I thank all the leaders for their support and empowerment of our ethnic pastors, churches, and ministries.

Our work is grounded in the gospel of Jesus Christ, which transcends culture, language, and status, calling all people into one body. We proclaim, with the Apostle Paul, "Here there is no Gentile or Jew, circumcised or uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave or free, but Christ is all, and is in all" (Colossians 3:11 NIV). In Christ, we are one humanity, formed by grace and united in mission, with every part of the body indispensable to the whole (Romans 12:5).

Over the past year, the Committee on Ethnic Ministry has continued to meet monthly, focusing on key areas. For 2025, we expanded our work to include six strategic priorities:

1. **Building Relationships:** Our conference spans multiple states and encompasses a diverse range of people and places. We remain committed to fostering strong personal and pastoral relationships that help unify and strengthen our community.
2. **Sharing Leadership:** Our committee continues to equip ethnic leaders to serve in wider conference leadership. Ethnic representation remains active in many committees throughout the conference. We affirm the value of including diverse voices to offer unique insight and wisdom in our decision-making processes.
3. **Supporting Ethnic Churches and Pastors:** We maintain ongoing contact with numerous ethnic churches and pastors who are discerning their future, particularly those within the UMC. We are committed to walking alongside them, offering spiritual, relational, and practical support, including help with finances and worship space.
4. **Partnership Churches:** To address financial instability among ethnic churches, we continue to encourage partnerships between ethnic congregations and more resourced churches. These partnerships can offer encouragement, shared ministry, and mutual blessing.
5. **Education:** We continue to promote awareness and understanding of how local churches can structure and adapt their ministries to reflect and reach their communities. This includes offering resources on worship styles, pastoral assignments, and leadership development. We emphasize that while diversity is a goal of the gospel, it must be pursued with discernment and not elevated above the centrality of Christ.
6. **Cross-Racial/Cross-Cultural (CR/CC) Training:** In 2025, we launched a new initiative to equip churches and pastors for effective cross-racial and cross-cultural ministry. Through theological foundations, practical workshops, and relational strategies, this training is helping local churches navigate differences with grace and courage. Our goal is not just inclusion, but transformation—learning to love, lead, and worship together across ethnic and cultural lines.

We celebrate what God is doing among us and remain hopeful. Thank you for your continued prayers and support as we seek to embody the reconciling work of Christ in all we do.

Jethro Project Report

Jethro, though not a prominent figure in Scripture, blessed God's people through his seasoned experience and insight. As the Upper Midwest Conference grows towards the vital organization necessary for the Kingdom building work to which it is called, some structural assistance is offered by the Senior Members of the Conference. These men and women labored for decades in the church and movement(s) that birthed the Global Methodist Church. Their passion for Christ, expertise and experience in ministry could be very valuable in these fledgling moments of our ministry when channeled towards specific things.

The "Jethro Project" presents the following report of our activity for the Conference Year 2024-2025.

1. The **Pastor and Congregation Prayer** project pairs a "Senior Member" with a District to pray daily for every pastor and their congregation in their district and directly contact each pastor periodically to listen, encourage and pray with them. Pastors have received this well and 14 of our 18 Districts are being ministered to in this way and we seek to fill the remaining 4 spots this summer.
2. Retreats led by the Jethro Project entitled "**Let's be Methodist Together**" constructed for the purpose of connecting clergy together and encouraging them to imbed "Methodism" in the DNA of their congregations. Four districts have already experienced the retreat and other districts in the conference have been invited to get this exciting and inspirational gathering on their calendars in 2025 or '26.
3. In person **seminary visits** at Indiana Wesleyan, United, Asbury and Wesley Biblical Seminary were made by a "Jethro" with the purpose of building relationships with students and staff for the purpose of recruiting new pastors to the Upper Midwest Conference.
4. "Jethroes" have ministered in many other ways this year including:
 - a. One Jethro led a 5-day revival in Ashland, NE sponsored by our GMC and five other churches in that community.
 - b. Several have written articles for the digital biweekly Conference Communication and for the Article Archives on the Conference Website.
 - c. Two are working on a program regarding Cross Cultural/Cross Racial pastoral appointments, coaching and ministries.
 - d. Most Jethro's are counseling, encouraging or coaching one or a few pastors.
 - e. Several are in conversation and/or meeting with churches considering becoming GMC.

 - i. We have worked to establish our role and come up with a framework for how our committee will operate.
 - ii. Bishop Webb has helped us shape how our committee will function.

 - c. The role of the committee is defined in Paragraph 710.3 of the BODD
 - i. Our framework is as follows
 1. We exist to support the Conference Superintendents by:
 - a. Making ourselves available for counsel
 - b. Supporting them through the budget
 - c. Making them aware of and talking through things that need to be addressed in our conference
 - d. Providing oversight
 - e. Consulting them about continuing education
 2. We also exist to support the conference by:
 - a. Interpreting to the conference the nature of superintendency
 - b. Consulting with Bishop Webb
 - c. Keeping our meetings confidential
 - d. Being eyes and ears in the conference and communicating to the Superintendents issues that need to be addressed
 - d. We have agreed that the chair of the committee will touch base with the Superintendents monthly to address any needs and to pray
 - e. Our meetings for the time being will be as needed
 - f. The Superintendency Committee would like to communicate to the churches that if there are conference level issues that need to be addressed to please contact a member of the committee so that we can bring it to the Superintendents to be addressed
 - g. We also ask that you would be actively praying for Ross and James personally and professionally as they continue to lead our conference with integrity, grace, and discernment.

Nominations & Leadership Development Report

The Nominations and Leadership Development Committee is responsible for nominating both clergy and laity to serve on annual conference committees and boards. We also provide resources and opportunities for church and leadership development.

I began serving as the committee's vice chair in January. Since then, we have met monthly to focus on aligning our committees with the requirements of the Book of Discipline. This includes working to ensure proper representation and balance between clergy and laity, as well as confirming that committee assignments comply with the guidelines regarding who can serve and for how long.

Given the size and newness of our conference—and the geographical distance between us, we are still learning who people are and what gifts they bring. That's made the process more challenging, but we're making good progress. We've also been intentional about trying to secure representation from the various states in our conference whenever possible.

In addition to filling committees, we've been reviewing term lengths and reappointment eligibility to ensure everything is consistent with the Discipline. We are also preparing descriptions for each committee that outline responsibilities and term limits. This will help potential nominees understand what they're signing up for.

Another area of focus has been planning breakout sessions for Annual Conference. These sessions are intended to train local churches in the responsibilities of various church boards and roles, equipping them for more effective ministry.

Looking ahead, after Annual Conference we plan to begin developing a resource database to support local churches. The vision is to connect churches that are thriving in specific ministry areas with others who may need support or guidance. This will take time, but we believe it will be a valuable tool for strengthening ministries across the conference.

We've also utilized a self-nomination process and reached out to individuals recommended for specific committees. We've done our best to place people where their gifts and passions align with the needs of the conference. While most positions will be voted on at Annual Conference, we expect to take a few nominations from the floor to fill in any remaining openings.

Lastly, I want to thank the entire committee for their hard work and dedication. This process has not been without challenges, especially as we navigate the requirements of the Discipline and adjust accordingly. For example, although I was initially asked to serve as chair, the Discipline states that the Conference Superintendent must serve in that role. So, James Parks is our official chair, and I continue to assist him however I can, knowing he already carries many responsibilities.

I look forward to seeing many of you at Annual Conference. If you have ideas, know someone who would be a good fit for committee service, or have a successful ministry you'd be willing to share with others, please reach out to me. We'd love to include those stories in the resource network we're building.

Our Purpose: To grow as disciples, making communities that spread scriptural holiness around the world.

The Upper Midwest Conference partners with the South African Conference of the Global Methodist Church to fulfill our purpose and celebrate the mandate of the Global Methodist Church's commitment of making disciples at home and around the world. The Upper Midwest Conference in our last Conference year has:

1. Faithfully tithed our operational budget to our partnership. The Lord's tithe enables the South African Conference to organize and develop the rudimentary administrative framework necessary for the efficient fulfillment of the Global Methodist mandate. Our support along with the support of the Florida Conference provides for the fundamental resources for developing a Conference office.
2. Developed personal relationships with the South African Conference by sending representatives to the South African Convening Conference last November. Rev. James Parks and Mrs. Norma Morrison were special guests of the South African Conference visiting the work of the church from the shores of the Indian to the shores of the Atlantic Oceans.
3. Engaged in the development of a Memorandum of Understanding between our conference, Florida Conference, and the South African Conference. This covenantal agreement sets forth the framework of how our partnership will work. It guides our expectations and amplifies our areas of mutual help and fellowship. The Memorandum of Understanding fosters our mutual trust and commitment.

The Upper Midwest Conference is committed to supporting our partnership with South Africa in our 2025/26 Conference year through this Memorandum of Understanding:

INTRODUCTION

The Florida Annual Conference, the Upper Midwest Annual Conference, and the South Africa Annual Conference express a mutual desire to enter into a Covenant Agreement dedicated to sustainably fulfilling our mission of making faithful disciples of Jesus Christ. This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) recognizes the sacred privilege and responsibility we share as Christ's Church in the world and will serve as a foundation for the future creation of the Covenant Agreement.

BACKGROUND

The Global Methodist Church in Florida, the Upper Midwest, and South Africa are blessed with committed and passionate leaders who prioritize spiritual growth, discipleship, and service. Our churches have a history of active involvement in local communities, addressing social needs, and fostering meaningful relationships. Our congregations are composed of individuals with diverse talents and skills, enabling effective ministry and outreach efforts.

We aspire to nurture a relationship at the conference, district, and local church/circuit levels to better understand and address the challenges we face, keep one another in prayer, and provide encouragement and support.

All three conferences are embracing new structures and ways of being the Church as we serve Jesus as part of the Global Methodist Church. As a denomination, we are consciously deciding to provide vision, leadership, and support toward sustainability to the local church while remaining lean regarding costs.

In response to the numerous connectional partnerships emerging between newly established U.S. Annual Conferences and non-U.S. Annual Conferences, the General Church has established the GMC Commission on Evangelism, Church Multiplication, Mission Mobilization, and Disaster Response. As a result, the Partnership Ambassadors Team was created to assist conferences in establishing partnerships that are mutual, respectful, and aimed at self-sustainable administrative structures. The goal is to support the church's commitment to making faithful disciples of Jesus Christ in generous, missionally healthy ways.

We recognize that completing a Covenant Agreement depends upon continued shared experiences and information between our conferences, along with best-practice input from the Partnership Ambassadors Team.

IMMEDIATE SITUATION

The South Africa Annual Conference faces financial constraints that limit its ability to fund ministry growth initiatives, maintain facilities, and support missions.

The Florida and Upper Midwest Annual Conferences are in their second year of existence and continue to establish policies and procedures.

ACTIONS & PLANS TO DATE

Relationship Development:

- A delegation from the Florida and Upper Midwest Annual Conferences visited South Africa in November 2024.
- The Florida and Upper Midwest Annual Conferences are both planning conference-wide mission trips to Blessman International (Mokopani, Limpopo, South Africa) in the coming year.

We believe that we benefit from deep and meaningful relationships. Clergy and laity from both Annual Conferences can learn from one another and deepen their faith by coming together as the Body of Christ.

Financial Support:

For 2024-2025, the Florida and Upper Midwest Annual Conferences allocated grants for start-up costs for the South Africa Annual Conference of \$50,000 (Florida) and \$40,000 (Upper Midwest).

These grants were given to the Global Methodist Church denominational office. The denominational office wired the funds directly to the South Africa Annual Conference.

Based on the budget submitted by the South Africa Annual Conference, the Florida and Upper Midwest Annual Conferences will tithe off of their connectional funding. Grants will be wired directly to the South Africa Annual Conference quarterly. Accurate financial statements must be provided each quarter before the next quarter's grant is wired:

- Salary for the Conference Superintendent
- Salary for the Conference Operations Officer
- Salary for the Presiding Elders
- Costs for Office Support
- Costs for Office Rent, Supplies, and Utilities
- Costs for Insurance and Transportation

The Florida and Upper Midwest Conferences will not provide support for pastors' salaries; however, as part of the covenant development process, we will consider other benefits, such as partnerships between local churches in the three annual conferences that could include sponsoring part of the pay for a South African pastor.

The goal of our transitional partnership is to help the South Africa Annual Conference become self-sustaining. (This is the goal for all non-U.S. annual conferences with partners in the United States.) Toward this end, the transitional administrative assistance will reduce by 20% each year through 2029-30.

GMC South Africa – Commitment and Contribution

As part of our dedication to the ongoing partnership between GMC South Africa, the Florida Conference, and the Upper Midwest Conference, we affirm the following commitments:

1. **Quarterly Financial Reporting**
 - o We commit to providing quarterly financial reports related to the funding received, ensuring transparency, accountability, and responsible stewardship.
2. **Ministerial Exchange and Collaboration**
 - o We will make our clergy personnel available for ministerial exchange and collaboration with the Florida and Upper Midwest Conferences to foster mutual growth, learning, and spiritual enrichment.
3. **Church Business and Operational Skills Exchange**
 - o We welcome the opportunity to engage in an exchange of church administration and operational skills among the three conferences to strengthen governance and ministry effectiveness.
4. **Children's Ministry with an Intentional Focus**
 - o We aim to invest in the solid establishment of children's ministries with a global and intentional focus. However, we would appreciate support from our partner conferences to help drive and implement this mission.
5. **Project Accountability**
 - o We are committed to maintaining full accountability in every project we undertake, including planning, execution, and reporting.
6. **Church Growth and Development**
 - o We will actively work towards planting and growing churches within our conference, contributing to the broader mission of the Global Methodist Church and the goals of the General Conference.
7. **Circuit and Local Church Partnership Missions**
 - o We express our desire to see the realization of circuit-level and local church partnership missions between our conferences, strengthening the grassroots impact of our collective ministry.
8. **Education and Training**
 - o We are committed to the continuous education and development of our pastoral trainees, ordained pastors, and administrative personnel, ensuring that all are well-equipped to serve effectively.

Next Steps

- **Educational Opportunities for South African Pastors:**
 - o Develop a coaching ministry for South African pastors led by the Rev. Tim Carson of the Florida Conference.
 - o Explore opportunities to train South African pastors through seminaries in Africa.
 - o Explore providing South African pastors with a laptop computer or tablet so that training can occur via Zoom.
 - o Topics for leadership development (as stated by South African pastors) are:
 - Improved management skills
 - Counseling
 - How to use Zoom and other technology
 - Communicating effectively with congregations
 - Helping local churches to be financially sustainable

- Conflict resolution
- Empowering laity
- Doctrine of the Global Methodist Church
- Strategic planning for local churches
- Determining the needs of a church to match the correct pastor and gifts
- Building a stronger clergy culture among pastors
- Building partnerships with schools and the community
- Church planting
- Starting a health clinic
- Recruiting younger clergy
- Evangelism
- Rural, urban, and suburban ministry effectiveness

- **Relationship Building:** Continue to strengthen our partnership through regular communication via Zoom and WhatsApp.
- **Covenant Agreement Development:** Continue working on the Covenant Agreement to include conversations regarding these topics and more:

Finance Report

Below is the 2025 Conference Budget Report. This report reflects our continued commitment to stewarding the resources entrusted to us with integrity, transparency, and a focus on the mission and ministry of the Global Methodist Church in the Upper Midwest. After a full year of connectional giving and information from our year end statistics, we are recommending a proposed budget of \$459,000 for the 2025-2026 fiscal year.

Some highlights of the budget include approval, in February by the Leadership Council, to double the stipend from \$250 to \$500 monthly to the churches providing a Presiding Elder. The time commitment for the Presiding Elders was more than originally anticipated. An increase for Board of Ministry for background evaluations and clergy training. Also, we are partnering with Dirt Road Network with the multiplication team for church planting. Finally, we've added 5 new ministry teams budget lines for the coming year: Communications, Disaster, Missions, Women's Ministries and Foundation.

In addition to the budget, we have included a **Statement of Financial Position** to provide a clear and accurate snapshot of the conference's financial health as of the most recent fiscal year-end. This statement outlines our assets, liabilities, and net assets, offering valuable context to support your understanding of the budget and our financial trajectory. We believe this transparency helps reinforce our shared accountability and strengthens the foundation upon which we build ministry together. You will see in this statement that we have received \$97,000.00 more than we spent in the last year. These funds will be used to give us some margin for responding when God calls. Our goal is to have some reserve funds, but also to use the majority of our resources for God's kingdom work.

As we look to the future, the Conference Finance Committee and leadership have also begun initial conversations around the formation of a **Conference Foundation**. The purpose of this foundation would be to support long-term financial sustainability and to open new avenues for ministry funding, including legacy giving, endowment development, and donor engagement. We believe that forming a foundation will help equip the conference to more fully resource local churches, new church starts, and mission initiatives for generations to come. More information and recommendations on this initiative will be shared as the exploration continues.

The enclosed budget has been prayerfully prepared with these long-term goals in mind, alongside our commitment to present needs. It reflects a balance of fiscal responsibility and faith-driven vision. We remain focused on supporting local churches, clergy, discipleship efforts, church planting, and the administrative functions necessary to sustain our shared ministry.

We recognize the importance of financial clarity in sustaining trust and unity across our connection. As always, we welcome your questions, feedback, and continued dialogue about any aspect of the budget, the financial position, or our future plans.

We also decided to try meeting on a Friday, Saturday, and Sunday to better help and open the opportunity for more laity, clergy spouses, young adults, and teens to attend.


